Dimitri Christakis, **MD**, **MPH** is the George Adkins Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Washington; the Director of the Center for Child Health, Behavior & Development at Seattle Children's Hospital Research Institute; and an attending pediatrician at Children's Hospital in Seattle. He is also a prolific author of over 130 original research articles, a textbook of pediatrics, and the parenting book, *The Elephant in the Living Room: Make Television Work for Your Kids*. (September 2006; Rodale). His research focuses on the effects of media on child health and development and has been featured on Anderson Cooper 360, the Today Show, ABC, NBC, and CBS news as well as all major national newspapers. He speaks frequently to national and international audiences of pediatricians, parents and educators about the effects of media on children of all ages.
