**James T. Webb, Ph.D.** has been recognized as one of the 25 most influential psychologists in gifted education. In 1981, he established SENG (Supporting Emotional Needs of Gifted), a national non-profit organization with programs that support gifted individuals and the parents, educators and health professionals that support them. He is the lead author of five books including *A Parent's Guide to Gifted Children* and *Misdiagnosis and Dual Diagnoses of Gifted Children and Adults*.
