MICHELLE CHAPPEL, Ph.D. (Princeton) was voted “Most Inspirational Psychology Professor” at UC Santa Cruz, but ditched academics to follow her childhood dream to be a singer-songwriter. Her songs have won numerous Billboard awards, been on the radio charts, and appeared on ABC, HBO, Encore, and Showtime. For the past decade she’s led creativity workshops and helped thousands of people on the road to personal fulfillment and success. She’s also served as an international research consultant for companies such as Google, eBay, Virgilio, TiVo, and Yahoo!

Michelle was born in France, and raised in Georgia. Singing at the age of four, she eventually left music behind to pursue a Ph.D. in psychology from Princeton. When she was a professor, students used to line up outside her office to ask for her advice. She always told them to follow their hearts. One afternoon she realized she wasn’t following her own heart, and left teaching to become a singer-songwriter.

Michelle recently released a music video, filmed by Emmy-award winning editor Mike Pierce, to help raise awareness about homelessness. Based on her Billboard-winning song "No Place like Home," the video has already inspired people across the world to donate food, clothing, and money to local homeless organizations. “The Santa Clara” recently compared Michelle to Bob Dylan and Leonard Cohen “in her mission to speak for the people and send out a message of hope to an economically derailed society”.

Just under 5 feet tall, the petite singer has a strong and dynamic voice, and compelling message for our times.

Edmond Fischer was born in Shanghai, China on 6 April, 1920. He carried out all his studies in Switzerland where he earned a PhD degree in Chemistry at the University of Geneva. After spending a year at the California Institute of Technology, he joined the Department of Biochemistry at the University of Washington, Seattle, where he is now Professor Emeritus. It is in Seattle that he initiated his collaborative studies with Edwin G. Krebs on the regulation of cellular processes by reversible protein phosphorylation. In recent years, he has been particularly interested in the role played by cytoplasmic and receptor protein tyrosine phosphatases in signal transduction and cell transformation. He has served on various Scientific Advisory Boards, and is presently on the Board of Scientific Governors of the Scripps Research Institute in La Jolla, CA, and of the Weizmann Institute of Sciences, in Rehovot, Israel. He is a member of the National Academy of Science and of several Science Academies abroad, and was awarded honorary degrees from a number of U.S. and foreign Universities. In 1992, he and Dr. Krebs were awarded the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine for their discoveries concerning reversible protein phosphorylation as a biological regulatory mechanism.

Before entering the digital entertainment industry David was a Strategy Consultant at one of the nation's top strategy consulting firms, Monitor Company in Boston, Massachusetts. David helped Fortune 100 companies develop and implement corporate strategies, acquisitions, and divestitures.

David received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science with a minor in Business Management from Brigham Young University. He was a collegiate scholar-athlete. David currently serves on the National Advisory Board for the College of Family, Home and Social Sciences at BYU.

David grew up in Parma, Idaho where his parents own and operate a successful agribusiness. David and his wife Meggin have been married since 1993 and have five children. David stays involved with Scouting and local youth groups and enjoys golfing and skiing.
